- Listen attentively and clap appreciatively after the song.
- Stay for the entire concert.

WHAT IS A BALL?

A ball is a formal dance event often characterized by a banquet followed by a social dance. Ball dancing emerged from formal dances during the Middle Ages and carried on through different iterations throughout succeeding centuries, such as the 17th century Baroque dance and the 18th century cotillion. Several variations exists such as the masquerade and debutante ball as well as the more modern prom.

The word *ball* derives from the Latin word *ballare*, meaning 'to dance', and *bal* was used to describe a formal dancing party in French in the 12th century. The *ballo* was an Italian Renaissance word for a type of elaborate court dance, and developed into one for the event at which it was performed. The word also covered performed pieces like *II ballo delle ingrate* by Claudio Monteverdi (1608). The French developed the verb *baller*, and the noun *bal* for the event—from where it swapped into languages like English or German—and *bailar*, the Spanish and Portuguese verbs for 'to dance' (although all three Romance languages also know *danser*, *danzar*, and *dançar* respectively). Catalan uses the same word, *ball*, for the dance event. *Ballet* developed from the same root.

The grandest balls were at the French court in the Chateau de Versailles, with others in Paris. At royal balls, most guests did not expect to be able to dance, at least until very late in the night. Indeed, throughout the period dancers seem to have been a minority of the guests, and mostly drawn from the young and unmarried. Many guests were happy to talk, eat, drink, and watch. A *bal blanc* ("white ball", as opposed to a *bal en blanc*, merely with an all-white theme) was or is only for unmarried girls and their chaperones, with the women all in white dresses. The modern debutante ball may or may not continue these traditions, but are typically worn with pure white Ball gowns and opera-length white gloves.

The Duchess of Richmond's ball in Brussels in 1815, dramatically interrupted by news of Napoleon's advance, and most males having to leave to rejoin their units for the Battle of Waterloo the next day, has been described as "the most famous ball in history".

Balls also took place in Colonial America especially after the early 18th-century. The wealthy who participated in these dances followed a strict social code with mistakes in choreography scrutinized and a loss of prestige would follow excessive dance errors. (Credit: Wikipedia)

HISTORY OF THE BOISE TUESDAY MUSICALE AND DUNKLEY MUSIC ANNUAL 12-PIANO CONCERT

In 1962, Boise Tuesday Musicale (BTM) and Dunkley Music sponsored their first Multi-Piano "Monster" Concert. The Boise High School gym was filled with pianos and performing students from all over the Treasure Valley. It wasn't until 2002 that the next concert, "A Piano Monster Concert," was organized by Milana Colt. Twelve teachers participated and approximately 140 students performed. Dunkley Music delivered ten pianos for the concert held in the Lake Hazel Middle School gym and Mark Dunkley has been providing pianos ever since. These 12-Piano Concerts would not be possible without the incredible generosity of Dunkley Music. Please take time to thank them.

The event has now been held consecutively since 2004 with many changes and improvements. Narration, lighting, decorations, and string instruments have been added. Over the years there have been dancers, a bell choir, saxophones, trombones, flutes, clarinets, and oboes. Whereas pianos usually accompany other instruments, we have instruments accompanying pianos!

In 2016, for the "I've Got Rhythm" concert, a rhythm combo was added and drummer Jonathan Fulwood joined performers. He has been a part of the concerts ever since, providing a greater cohesiveness in the performances. He is an amazing musician, with a great ability to improvise, understand style, and adapt to the needs of the various conductors. We are so grateful for his contribution.

In 2017, for the 15th concert celebration, "There's a Monster in my Music," the concerts took another big step. The audiences and participants had outgrown the high school auditoriums the concerts had been held in and moved to the Swayne Auditorium at NNU and added two more pianos on stage. Once again, Dunkley Music showed their amazing generosity and support by being willing to continue to bring not only the pianos needed on stage but also rehearsal pianos. Dunkley Music's generosity has made possible 21 concerts, which in turn has provided thousands of dollars for musical scholarships. This year we have over 40 of the finest teachers in the valley participating, and over 300 musicians performing.

Our thanks to each of you – teachers, parents, students, and volunteers who have continued to support and participate in the Annual 12-Piano Concert and made this one of the longest running Multi-Piano Concerts in the USA.

Boise Tuesday Musicale is a Chapter of the Idaho Federation of Music Clubs and the National Federation of Music Clubs. The Club was organized in 1915 and became a part of the National Federated Club in 1942. The club is 109 years old!!! Our express purpose is to advance interests and promote the culture of musical art. This includes providing financial awards for young musicians as well as musical education for our members.

BOISE TUESDAY MUSICALE

Boise Tuesday Musicale members include professional and amateur musicians, music educators, parents, students, generous benefactors, and music lovers. We invite you to become a member and participate in promoting musical opportunities in the Treasure Valley. Your unique experiences and talents will help the BTM Board be stronger and help this organization to grow.

Festivals: Each year BTM sponsors Federated Festivals where each student is adjudicated on his/her performance. A rating system awards points that coincide with the judge's rating. Gold cups are awarded when a total of 15 points are earned. Each succeeding cup is larger in size, culminating with the possibility of earning a President's Cup.

Awards: Students who are at an elementary or above level and receive a superior rating in Festival may audition for award money to be used to further their musical education. Proceeds of the 12-Piano Monster Concert are used for these awards in addition to funds donated by generous benefactors. We give over \$5,000 annually to deserving music students.

Workshops: We offer workshops to help teachers improve their skills and encourage music outreach programs.
